Introduction

Our **School-Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT)** is a one-year, school-based route into teaching. From day one you'll be in the classroom, building relationships with pupils, learning on the job, and gaining the confidence and skills you need to succeed. Alongside this, you'll receive subject-specific training and expert guidance to help you become the best teacher you can be.

By the end of the programme, you'll be awarded **Qualified Teacher Status (QTS)** and a **Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE)** – and, more importantly, you'll be ready to inspire the next generation.

The Course

Our one-year, **research-led SCITT programme** gives you hands-on experience from day one, training in a school local to you. You'll spend **four days a week in the classroom** to start, supported by a skilled mentor, and **one day a week in training** designed by Teach First's expert curriculum team. You will end the programme on an 80% timetable.

The programme kicks off with **two weeks of intensive training** in September, covering the essentials such as behaviour management and lesson planning. You'll also take part in additional intensive training weeks later in the year.

Alongside your core placement, you'll gain **broadier experience in other schools**, building subject knowledge, practical skills, and strategies to manage workload and wellbeing.

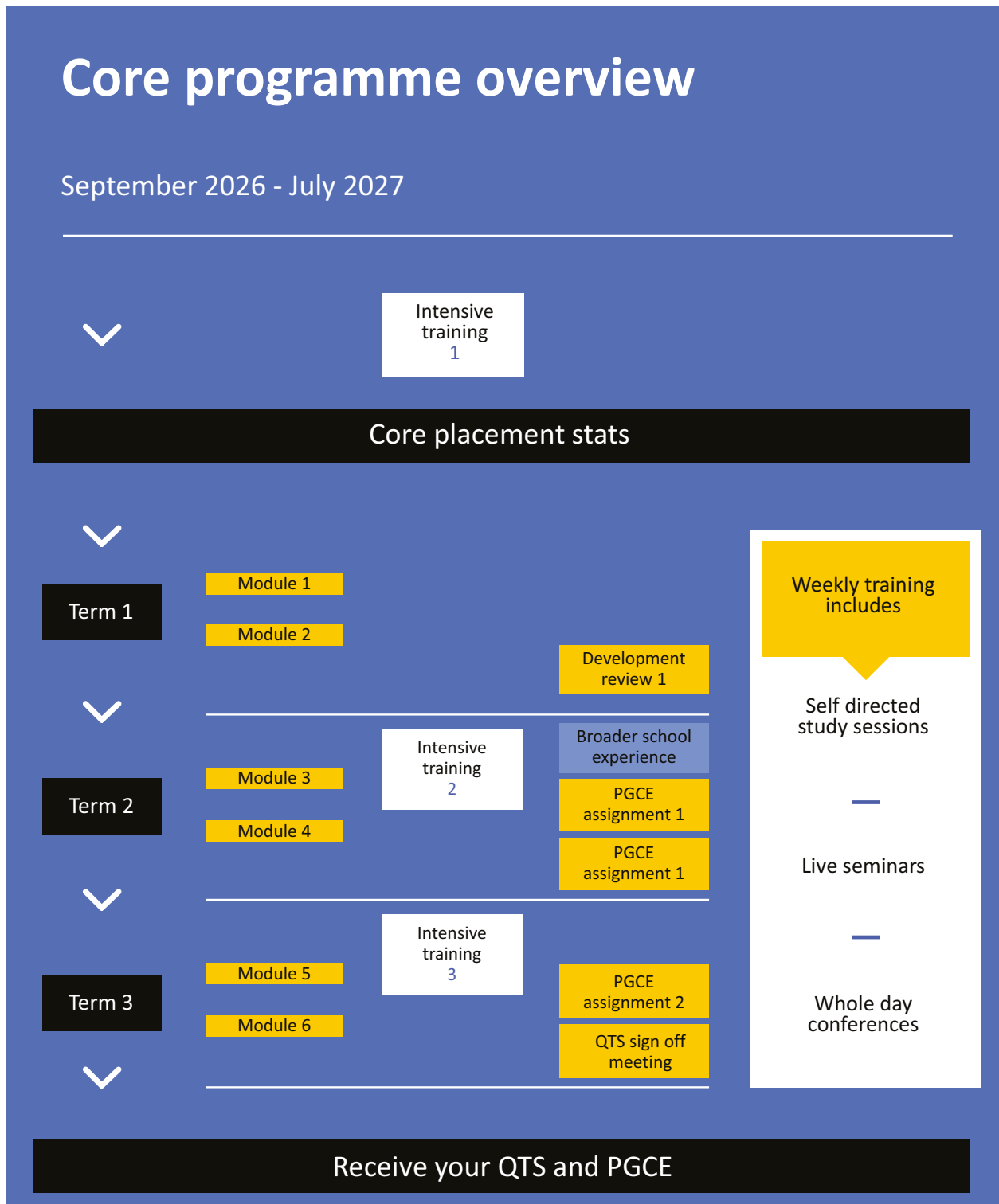
By the end of the year, you'll achieve **Qualified Teacher Status (QTS)**, a **PGCE with 60 master's credits**, and the confidence and expertise to thrive as an early career teacher.

Mentoring and support

You'll be eased into teaching by shadowing other expert teachers, before leading your own lessons with guidance from more experienced colleagues.

You'll work with a skilled and knowledgeable subject-specific mentor who will meet with you regularly to give you guidance. Your lead mentor will deliver your training alongside subject experts and oversee your progress throughout the year.

Your mentors also receive support and training from Teach First and us to ensure that they are briefed on the latest research and can tailor their coaching to suit your needs.



Eligibility

To be eligible to apply you will need:

- an undergraduate degree, or equivalent.
- to demonstrate sufficient knowledge in the subject you are applying to teach, either through your degree qualification, your A levels or relevant experience.
- grade 4 (C) or above in English and maths GCSEs, or equivalent qualification.

We will not consider candidates with pending GCSEs. Functional skills qualifications are not equivalent to maths and English GCSEs.

We accept most equivalency test providers. You will need to have passed your GCSE equivalency test before applying to our programme; we will not be able to process your application until you have passed.

Overseas qualifications will be reviewed by the UK national agency for international qualifications and skills (ENIC) to ensure they meet programme requirements.

International candidates

You'll need the right to study in the UK. You already have this if, for example, you:

- are an Irish citizen.
- have settled or pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme (you may still be able to apply).
- have indefinite leave to remain in the UK.

If you do not already have the right to study in the UK, you may need to apply for a visa. The main visa for fee-paying courses (those that you have to pay for) is the Student visa. We do NOT sponsor visas.

Fees and financial support

This is a fee paying course - The course fees for UK students in 2026–27 are expected to remain in line with recent years (2024–25 fees were £9,535). As a full-time student on our SCITT, you will have access to a wide range of student benefits and can apply for a tuition fee loan (subject to eligibility).

In addition, **depending on your subject and qualifications, you may be eligible for a government-funded bursary or grant in 2026** to support you throughout your training. These can make a significant difference to your year of study.

We strongly encourage all applicants to check the Department for Education's website for the latest information on bursary amounts and subject eligibility before applying.

Course accessibility

Equality, diversity, and inclusion are fundamental to our programmes and partnerships. You will have access to our partner university's support services, and we will take a tailored approach to all reasonable adjustments trainees may need. You will be able to apply to Student Finance for additional support dependent on eligibility, for example Disabled Students' Allowance.
