



Allocation of Catch Up funding 2020 – 21

Statement published from Department for Education 23.09.20

Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds will be among those hardest hit. The aggregate impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response must match the scale of the challenge.

We know that we have the professional knowledge and expertise in the education system to ensure that children and young people recover and get back on track. Returning to normal educational routines as quickly as possible will be critical to our national recovery, and the government intends for schools and colleges to fully open in September.

The government has announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up. This includes a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time.

Funding allocation

Schools' allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years reception through to 11.

This means a typical primary school of 200 pupils will receive £16,000 while a typical secondary school of 1,000 pupils will receive £80,000.

Action Tutoring Programme This is to ensure that identified students who are closest to their exams get the support their exams receive the support they need to secure appropriate outcomes. The programme is targeted at students on the cusp of achieving a 5 in English and/ or Maths. The programme is delivered online on Saturday mornings through 1 to 2 tutoring Supervision	£5,400

Additional TA In Reception With the class TA approaching 28 weeks of pregnancy before the end of September, we took HR advice and allowed her to work from home. We interviewed and employed an agency TA to cover the absence to allow for greater consistency following the settling in period of our new Reception cohort.	£2,930 (up to 28th wk.)
