Pupils' homework is marked and forms part of their progress report throughout the year. Helping your child with their homework also gives you insight into what is being taught at school and gives you a clearer indication of your child's level of learning. 
GOLFING AT SCHOOL

STEM BOOK OF THE WEEK



Lift the spectacular spiral pop up to reveal the answer and meet each magnificent animal in its home.

Children learn what the animal eats, where it lives, what it looks like and what animal family it belongs to, as well as some quirky and funny facts about it. The reader then reveals by pulling up a tab on the opposite page, a creature suspended on a sturdy but invisible plastic cord. The creature appears in a whirlwind of spiralling paper at home in its natural environment. At the animal's feet is its name and so the pop up reveals the answer in a uniquely beautiful and satisfying way.

The national average for attendance is 95.8% for the whole school year. Our current overall percentage since returning in March is at **94.53%**.

Due to the Lockdown the reporting of our annual attendance has become a little more complex and some pupils' attendance may have been unfairly and negatively impacted. Therefore, whilst we work out these issues and how to best present the annual figure, we will only be showing the weekly attendance for the time being.

Please bear in mind that attendance isn't the only part of good percentages. Arriving on time at school is just as important and can also affect a child's education.


It is important that parents are aware that failure to bring your child to school and falling below the national average could <u>result in fines or court</u> <u>orders</u> being issued by the local authority.
