ADMISSIONS

Is your child due to start school in September 2022?

If your child was born between **1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018**, they can start school in September 2022, and you should apply for their place by Saturday 15 January 2022.

If you missed the memo, don't panic, there is still time and you can apply by visiting www.lbbd.gov.uk/school-admissions.

It's important to know that getting your child a place at school is not an automatic process, so you still have to apply, even if they are already at a school nursery or they have a brother or sister at that school.




The national average for attendance is 95.8% for the whole school year. Our current overall percentage is 94.4%
