# **Sugi Forest Tree Planting**

On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> March, pupils were selected from Years 1- 8, to plant our own Sugi forest in the grounds of Eastbrook school. James and his team explained to the pupils that they would be planting 1200 saplings, from 24 native varieties of trees. They would cover an area of 400 metres square and this would provide a sanctuary for insects and wildlife.

The children were very keen to get planting and with the assistance of some of our secondary pupils they got on with the job in hand in true horticultural style! After plants the multitude of saplings, they placed hay over the soil and roots to protect the trees. For some this was the highlight of the experience! We look forward to seeing our forest grow alongside our pupils!

### **Autism Awareness Week**


Year 3 pupils have embraced 'Autism Awareness Week' and took part in numerous activities.

Pupils have watched a short film in order to gain more insight into how autistic people see the world, things like the background noise of traffic, many of us take for granted and the disturbance does not bother us but for some autistic people this sound could be quite scary.

Pupils were able to empathise with autistic people through reading a book, 'A Friend for Henry', describing the experience of Henry (an autistic boy) making new friendships. The children then role played scenarios, to understand how they could make autistic people feel more comfortable in school situations. The class had lots of discussion about the correct use of actions and words to use during the scenarios.

Children looked at the 'Autism Awareness Week poster', given to us by Apollo and pupils created their own posters. Many children were also excited to wear their blue ribbons distributed by Apollo pupils, they are very proud to wear them!


The national average for attendance is 95.8% for the whole school year. Our current overall percentage is 94.58%
